If you wish to receive any new student loan(s), you must be able to:

I also acknowledge the student loan I am now applying for and may receive, and any subsequent student loan(s) I may receive hereafter, may not be cancelled due to any present impairment(s) unless my physician certifies the impairment(s) has substantially deteriorated to the point of a total and permanent disability.*
